This course comprises (3+1) four papers in all Paper-I and Paper-II are compulsory while paper – III is optional, the other options of Paper-III will be offered as and when it is feasible. In addition to these papers the candidates will have to write a dissertation on a topic in consultation with the supervisor. However, the candidates will be permitted to write their dissertation on passing in the first three papers.
